Report from the President



This year has been tremendously rewarding to serve as ODKF President. As I've shared on multiple occasions, the work that we are able to accomplish as a foundation is amazing, very gratifying, and certainly a very rewarding experience. I encourage all Kiwanians to serve in some capacity with ODKF to fully understand and appreciate the work ODKF members do to support all Ohio Kiwanis Clubs.

As I reflect on the work we were able to complete this year and the progress of ensuring a successful future for ODKF, there are a few things that come to mind but perhaps my favorite memory was working on the First Family Project at MidYear, when we assembled 155 backpacks for children in foster care programs. Watching my daughter Peytyn, dive in and participate in something so meaningful for other children was another reminder of why we do what we do as Kiwanis members.

I'm encouraged at the growth we've seen in our ODKF managed funds, now over 2.5 million with over 1 million in CAF funds. This ensures that we can continue to support our Ohio clubs in a very meaningful way. We continue to help clubs do more with their money through our CAF program. It's really amazing when we can show clubs a 15% - 18% - 22% increase on their funds and what that allows them to do in terms of service projects and with programs that support membership growth.

The ODKF grant process was exciting as always this year, knowing that the committees work has such a positive impact on the children and their communities, it almost leaves you speechless. This year, ODKF awarded over \$30K in special funding to approximately 30 clubs for SLP service projects. The Grants committee was chaired by Rita Corbin, who will be ODKF President next year. She did an amazing job across the board and I am positive that she will keep us focused in the year ahead.

ODKF recognized a dozen clubs this year who were celebrating milestone anniversaries of 50, 75, and 100 years of service. Each were awarded a \$100 check to be used for SLP service projects.

Today, you're receiving a special, commemorative pin, which was no small task let me tell you. After what seemed like hundreds of variations, more like twenty, we came to a census, on what will represent the ODKF brand for a few years. Please wear this proudly as a member of ODKF, whether you are on the board, serve on a committee or are simply a Kiwanian, you are a member!

Thanks to ODKF Executive Director Alan, for your guidance and suggestions. VP Rita, thank you for serving on multiple committees and your willingness to do whatever was needed. Brandi, thanks for helping me stay on point with everything! Travis, thanks for your insight and guidance on financials. To all committee chairs and ODKF members, that's for taking time from your family and friends to serve and make sure that everything ODKF does throughout the year has purpose and meaning. I couldn't have done this job without each and everyone of you. You are honestly, a tremendous asset to ODKF.

I want to thank my wife Jody, children Pierce, Peytyn, and Prestin for the sacrifices you have made throughout the year to allow me to have this life enriching experience as ODKF President. Thanks for your continued support. I am so proud that our family is so actively involved with Ohio Kiwanis.


