# GOVERNOR'S PROJECT



Disasters can strike anywhere and anytime. We may have warnings that alert us that a disaster is imminent, but not always. A disaster can strike in the middle of the night with no warning. They can hit states and regions like Gulf Coast hurricanes or devastate a half-dozen communities overnight like 2019's Memorial Day tornadoes. Disasters can even be caused by accidents like the Miamisburg Train Derailment in 1978, which caused thousands of Miamisburg residents to evacuate their homes.

This year's Governor's Project was designed to raise awareness about how natural disasters can devastate a community, what Kiwanis Clubs can do to help their communities recover, and how our District Foundation's Disaster Relief Grant program can assist in a time of need.

As of July 15th, 2022, the Governor's Project has raised \$11,975.00 for the Disaster Relief Fund. But raising awareness of Disaster Relief in Ohio has been priceless.

On the night of December 10 & 11th, 2021, approximately 50 tornadoes struck several midwestern states. Our neighbor to the south, Kentucky, was especially hard hit by this natural disaster, which included a historic storm that produced tornados that left a path of destruction more than 200 miles long.

Ohio District Kiwanis Governor Craig Smith, Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation President Jason Miller, and Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation Executive Director Alan Penn worked together to collect gifts in support of Kentucky-Tennessee District Disaster Relief. We were able to provide \$5,716 to the KT District Disaster Relief fund. Although we're not yet to the end of the Kiwanis year, our Governor's Project has already shown success. The fellowship and caring among our many Kiwanis communities has helped strengthen our preparedness for the next disaster--wherever and whenever it strikes.

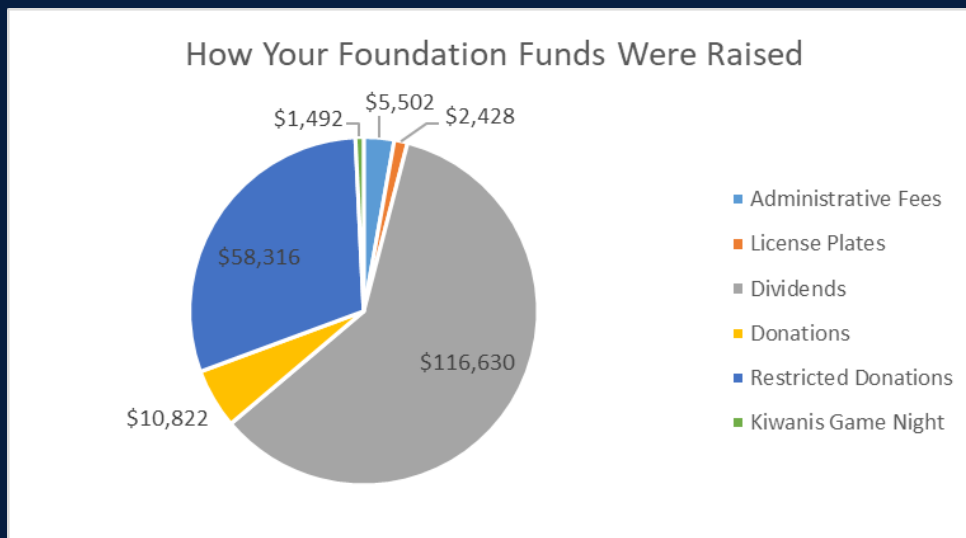
