KIWANIS FEEDS OHIO

As this year's first family project, "Feeding Ohio's Children," First Lady Barb Litzinger focused our efforts towards feeding hungry children. The main service project under this year's theme was creating weekend food packs. These packs were placed in the child's backpack on Friday before leaving school for the weekend providing them with a weekend supply of food.

According to Feeding America, Ohio's 16.9% food insecurity rate is higher than the national rating of 15.8% and higher than all other Midwestern states except Missouri (17%). This report also found that one in four children in Ohio (24.2%) live in food insecure households. The Food Research and Action Center called How Hungry is America? Found that more than one in six Ohioans answered yes to the question, "Have there been times in the past 12 months when you did not have enough money to buy food that you or your family needed?" This finding ranked Ohio 19th in the country for worst food hardship. Among Midwestern states, only Michigan ranked higher (14th).

Addressing the hunger need in our community is everyone's responsibility. Please consider continuing your weekend food pack programs throughout the coming years. If you do not have a weekend food pack program in your neighborhood please continue to support your local foodbanks and/or panties. Addressing hungry is a everyone's job.



The Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation was established in 1982 as a charitable not for profit corporation which accepts gifts from various sources to help the needs of the Ohio Kiwanis community.

All active, privileged, and senior members of the Ohio District of Kiwanis are automatically voting members of the Foundation which is governed by a Board of Trustees.

Funds earmarked for specific projects will be collected and distributed only to those projects. Funds which are not designated for specific projects are invested and only the proceeds of these investments may be used to help meet our mission. In accordance with IRS statute 501(c)3, donations, gifts, bequests of money or property to the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation are tax-exempt.

GRANT DEADLINES

The Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation is interested in funding service projects that can demonstrate an impact on the needs of children and others in the community. Grant applicants should keep in mind that priority is given to projects that

- Reach those persons who are not met by existing services
- Request seed money for innovative programs in the Foundation's field of interest
- Encourage matching gifts or additional funding from other donors, such as the general public or government
- Yield substantial benefits for the resources invested
- Support the Foundation's emphasis on Safe & Healthy Kids or community outreach
- Show involvement of Kiwanis family through volunteer service & financial commitment
- Request funds under \$5000
